## **Report on Pre Conference CME**

### **Theme: Competency Based Curricular Reforms in Community Medicine Postgraduates Training Programme**

Date: 29<sup>th</sup> October

**Time: 9.30 to 10:00am**

**Speaker Name: Dr. Sanjay Zodpey**

**Session: Contextualizing Global perspective for Advancing Reforms Agenda in Community Health Education in India**

The scientific session was fundamental in contextualizing global perspectives with the contribution of reports way back from 1910 such as Flexner, Gold mark and nursing education till 21<sup>st</sup> century today about the health education professions sparking the ground breaking reforms and the neo-challenges of health security threats. Need for thorough and authoritative re-examination of health profession education was emphasized. The observations consist in changing the landscape of public health education in India and competency based curriculum is needed.

**Session: Defining the role of Community Medicine specialists in addressing the health needs.**

A healthy vibrant talk on the role of Community Medicine in assessment of health needs with corollaries in health and the need for inter-sectoral co-ordination (health & non-health) was articulated. He emphasized on conceptualizing the community health needs (felt needs, demands and formative needs) assessment skills for distinguishing between individual needs and wider needs of community. He also spoke about creating evidence based support for public health actions and streamlining implementation barriers with public health department.

**Session: Competency Based Curricular Reforms In Community Medicine Postgraduate Training Programme: opportunities and Challenges.**

A clear, well formatted list of opportunities and challenges were discussed with the changing learning styles from self-directed learning to skill learning labs. He spotlighted on understanding the competency based professionalism and emphasized on MAYO clinic model. Competency based examination with three prolonged approach and stressed on biomedical humanistic. He concluded by giving a new method approach of LAOYO- Learning and assessment on your own.

**Session: Assessment methods in Competency Based Curriculum**

He began the session with the Lancet commission 2010 accentuating the education transformation to strengthen health system in an interdependent world and the core competencies needed for a public health professionals. The elements of competencies that are observable, measurable, practical and derived by experts were foreground and the role of deliberations in acquisition of expert performance was highlighted. Assessment of competency by using both formative and summative evaluation methods was considered.

Group activity was formulated- there were four groups and each group was given a topic to reframe the competency based skill reforms in community medicine under these headings- Formulating the content areas for developing stated competencies, designing teaching learning strategies and formulating methods of formative and summative assessments.

He pioneered the session by telling Public health can be considered a discovered discipline. We need to understand the changing landscape of public health education in India and the need and demand of public health professionals. Certain issues were considered such as the serious shortage of public health professionals and scarcity of data on public health professionals. He culminated by telling the need, demand and supply paradox and discussed the different career opportunities for public health professionals worldwide.

**Session: Current updates in management of diabetes mellitus in an urban setting**

Informative presentation on the management of diabetes mellitus and its compliance with emphasis on comprehensive management of diabetes mellitus was emphasized. Usefulness of diabetes club and the scientific evidence to undertake the complications and to improve glycemic control. Importance of annual check and updates in management of diabetes co-morbidities was dealt. Genuinely highlighted that diabetes management is not sugar management alone but comprehensive management.

He opened the session with a note on urban millennium. He discussed the problems of urban areas growing with socio-economic inequities, gender inequality. Brought out issues in



affordability of services and concluded with Krishnan committee recommendation and the role of government in JSY, JSSK and RSBY.

Brief presentation on research process was delivered. All aspects of research process including research question, study design, methodology, hypothesis, sample size, data analysis were been discussed. He added a note on inferential statistics, standard methods of data collection and concluded by spotlighting the role of statistician in planning and conduct of research.

Brief elaboration on the implementation and components of national urban health mission was discussed. The challenges faced by the officials of national urban health mission in implementation were addressed. He discussed about the district profile in different urban areas. Concluded with innovations in Karnataka with health Kiosks, urban health mobile medical unit, integrated care including maternity hospitals upgraded to urban primary health centers and secondary health care.

**a) Swachh Bharat mission:- Dr. RR Shinde**

Role of public health is mainly Swachhbharatabhiyaan. Creative ownership and mainstreaming community driven abhiyaan and system approach to sanitation and the role of local bodies.

**b) Biomedical Waste Management at hospital and home:- Dr. Pruthvish. S.**

Sanitation is a way of life. Should be developed as a culture. Biomedical waste management still in infancy. Household biomedical waste, Hazards of health care waste, liquid spill management, WHO assessment before decisions, non- incinerating strategies-

short term. Need of the hour to manage the problems associated with health care waste management.

**c) Sustainable development goals in the context of urban health:- Dr.K.Suresh**

Sustainable development goal is a continuum of MDG. Making cities and human settlement safe, Commuting pain index, Innovation for empowerment and economic growth.

A holistic approach at urban health incorporating the issue of waste management through sustainable development goals.

A very well delivered talk with looks into increasing the number of road traffic injuries due to continuous development. He also spoke about the causes of RTA. Need for multisectorial approach working proactively. Enabling road laws, behavioral change communication on road safety and management systems was emphasized. All injuries require rehabilitation. He concluded by telling the decade action for road safety 2011- 2020.

**Session: Symposium on Preventive Oncology**

The session started with addressing his 30years experience of existing health care system in the field of preventive oncology. He addressed the issues about the increasing awareness among people about cancer screening and the effectiveness of camp based approach and its cost effectiveness. The concern was the camps don't help in decreasing the incidence of cancer and theses camps just facilitate the people to approach for screening. The session concluded by affirmation from all KACH members that they will take this initiative to institutionalize screening camps on a regular basis.

**Plenary Session: Social security schemes- Government of Karnataka**

There were about 194 private hospitals which are empanelled for providing the free health care services. Specialties like preventive cardiology, preventive oncology and preventive neurology need to take their consultant specialist to remote areas. As there is an increase in number of people seeking benefits

He addressed the gathering by peroration emphasizing on the innovations of stakeholders and their role in community health profession. He spoke about the participation of medical colleges in improving the community health in urban areas. He concluded by encouraging young career professionals to apply for administration post in the government and private health sector.

**Sri U.T Khader** Hon Minister for Health and Family Welfare highlighted the issues and challenges in sector of health and suggested to bring out a change in the state with the help of central government. Audiences raised many questions on the appointment of MD community medicine doctors in the government sectors which was eventually taken into consideration.

He delivered a elaborative session on the current situation of polio eradication in India. He also stressed upon the importance of routine immunization and finally concluded by telling the necessity of strengthening Polio endgame strategy.

**Session: Tackling tuberculosis in urban areas**

She started off with the session with thematic set induction of delivering the Reaching the unreached. She spoke about the urban scenario- operational challenges, social challenges and the need for universal adoption of strategies of TB care. Urban tuberculosis was talk of the day emphasizing more on the networking strategies and poor quality of services. The issues are more concerned with the migratory population and the concern for deficient PH infrastructure.

**Session: Challenges for control of vector borne diseases in an urban context**

The speaker initiated the talk by highlighting the malaria trends, achievements in the Dakshina Kannada District. He intensified the challenges especially in urban area and issues concerning about the recent outbreak of dengue and Chikungunya and also about the Lymphatic filariasis. He also spoke about the potential breeding sites and issues in decreasing not up to desired level in Bijapur, Bagalkot, Gulbargah, Raichur, Bidar district.
